Blessing Box Ministry

The generous will themselves be blessed, for they share their food with the poor.

The blessing box has been sharing with others since it was installed on Sept 17, 2019. Eight church teams have been monitoring the blessing box routinely on a weekly basis. Community members almost weekly also leave items in the blessing box. We are blessed to be a part of a giving community.

In this new year the Missions Committee would like to ask if there are others in the church who would be interested in joining this monitoring of the blessing box. HBC has been quite generous, and supplies are maintained and can be used to stock the blessing box or you can provide your own items during your monitoring week. During this difficult time we have been stopping by and filling daily as needed. If you are interested in adding your name to the monitoring group, please contact Cindy Skelley (preferably at email sevaconn@aol.com) or call the church office.

In order to maintain supplies for the blessing box please also prayerfully consider adding a few items to your shopping list as you do your regular grocery shopping. You can place these items in the parlor on the floor by the cabinet in the corner that is behind the door. Example of items that move quickly from the blessing box are:

- □ small plastic jars of peanut butter
- □ ready to eat foods such as vienna sausages, beans, mac & cheese, tuna, chicken, fruit

Cheese Ministry

On Tuesday, December 8, the Cheese Ministry Partnership received another shipment of cheese. As you know, this partnership buys milk from local dairy farmers and distributes the resultant cheese to the community at no cost. About \$300,000 retail value worth of cheese has been delivered to the community so far this year. This 10,000 pounds (5 tons) of cheese went to various organizations around Harrisonburg. HBC was able to distribute 2,800 pounds through its ministry branches and partners. What an exciting effort was made by so many people in order to share this massive blessing.

To complete our cheese distribution, we are slicing the remaining pounds of cheese and will be sharing them individually within the community. If you have a family whom you would like to bless with a pound of delicious mozzarella, just let us know.

Dementia Ministry

Don Aittama 2021-2024

I was born and raised in the Detroit area in Michigan. As I was growing up my family vacationed frequently in the upper

peninsula of Michigan. I attended college at Central Michigan University between 1971 through 1975, earning a degree in Music. After graduation I entered the U.S. Marine Corps and served as an artillery officer. While in the Marine Corps I met my wife Julie and we got married in May 1976. I passed the CPA exam and worked for 10 years in public accounting, working primarily as an auditor.
