We know he grew up in a home, but the Scriptures suggest after the baptism Jesus lived as an itinerant teacher. As such, he was always in someone else's home and reliant on others' hospitality. Personally, I'm thankful this was his lifestyle and wasn't a lifestyle that took hold for most Christians. Although there are some followers of Christ who live closer to this model, most believers around the world follow Christ while living in permanent housing.

Hospitality, though, has always been a bedrock characteristic of the church. In fact, Christians influenced and introduced the Roman world to the acute care of others who were suffering. It was Christians who created hospitals that have continued as a resource for those in search of critical care ever since. Christian lifestyle and value helped change the way the Western world thought of its neighbors. Christians helped instill the need to care for the least of these among us. It's a value that still carries great weight in the secular world today, and it has its roots



Special Needs Christmas Eve Service

As we continue to look outward from the church, we have become aware of a need from a next door neighbor. Compass Counseling Services, whose office is beside our parking lot (on the South Liberty Street side), works with families and individuals navigating life with autism. One of the expressed needs for these family units is spiritual community. Families struggling with such spectrum challenges struggle to find churches able to meet their families' unique needs.

So, HBC is partnering with Compass Counseling Services to offer a Special Needs Christmas Eve Candlelight Service at 3:00 pm on Friday, December 24. We hope this may be the first of many expressions of church for these families. The aim of this service is to enable any families with special needs to have a safe space to worship God. We will provide a quiet room for those who have sensory sensitivities and a play room for those who struggle to sit through a service.

Please join us and invite any of your family and friends who would benefit from the additional support for individuals with special needs.

We needs volunteers who are willing to be the hands and feet of Christ for these families. We would ask volunteers to serve in sensory and play rooms to provide an alternative to worship if any of the children needed to take a break from the worship time. We would love to provide the families a chance to worship without having their attention redirected to their children. We will rely on the expertise of the Compass Counseling Services staff to equip us to serve well.

Missions Committee Updates

Thank you once again for your generosity! We are making a difference in the lives of many because you have a heart for others and a willingness to help those in need. Many of the packages for the Angel Tree gifts have already been delivered to church. Thank you!

Here is an update on several HBC mission projects:

All Angel Tree gifts are due by Sunday, December 5.

Operation Christmas Child Boxes: This year, we delivered 17 Operation Christmas Child boxes to the Church of the Nazarene. Some members chose to fill boxes on line. As a church, we will have prepared over 20 OCC boxes this year.



United in Christ Ministry: The missions committee, on behalf of HBC, sent a \$400 check to our UICM friends to use for Christmas boxes and their Soup Kitchen Ministry. Katelyn and the youth are currently planning their 2022 Trip to UICM where they will get a chance to assist in mission work in Texas and Mexico. We are excited to continue building a relationship with the UICM and our missionary friends, Marc and Chacho.

Computers for Bluefield: The missions committee, on behalf of HBC, sent a \$500 check toward computers for the Wade Center Childcare Center in Virginia. The members of the Bluefield partnership (WMUVA, CBFVA, and BGAV) challenged 25 churches to donate \$500 a piece to help get new computers for the Wade Center, giving students good, reliable computers to do Zoom meeting and online homework.

Christmas Food Bags: We will be delivering bags of food to our Grattan Street neighbors and others in the community in December. Each bag will include cheese and beef from from the Cheese and Beef Ministry. There will also be other items such as fresh produce, rice, beans, canned vegetables, flour and corn meal. How could this sinner make a blind man see?

Maybe the Pharisees were the ones who were blind. They needed to open their eyes and see Jesus for who he really was. We need the love of



Jesus today more than ever. We need to open our eyes to what Jesus has done for us. We need to believe and have faith that things will turn out okay. We certainly don't understand why bad things happen. Only God knows. But as Christians, we know that in the end, if we believe, everything will be all right.
