As one of the projects during Mission Madness weekend in April, Mike Mandigo worked with the students to construct ten bat houses. These wooden boxes provide shelter for bats who are key pollinators and insect consumers. Sam Huffman also constructed ten bat houses, so in total we have supplied the city of Harrisonburg with twenty unique bat houses. As soon as they're installed, the city Parks and Recreation department will geocode them. (Geocodes are geographic coordinates that allow anyone to find the item's location.) We will be able to see the direct fruits of our labor and track the impact of these bat houses for years to come!

This bat house installation project gives us another point of connection with the city. When the youth choir visited in late June, they heard from clients and staff at places they sang about the impact of HBC on the community. The kingdom of God is taking root in our city with a little bit of help from each of us. I'm grateful for the presence that we have as well as the light we shine. Little by little, lives are being changed and smiles are forming on the faces of those who experience desperation and isolation. May the bats who live in our houses not make as big an impact on this city as we can. Keep striving to bring the Kingdom of Heaven to Harrisonburg!

Real Freedom

As the Fourth of July approaches this year, our country celebrates 246 years of Independence. Many people will have picnics and other gatherings with family and friends to celebrate. Fireworks have always been a part of many celebrations.

When we think of freedom, we think of the men and women who have sacrificed to keep our country free. We think of our freedoms of religion, speech, and so many others. And we're thankful of these freedoms we have.

Today I'm thinking about another kind of freedom. 2 Corinthians 3:17 (NIV) says, "Now the Lord is the Spirit and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom."

Christ offers at least three freedoms: 1. Freedom from something, 2. Freedom in something, and 3. Freedom to something.

First, we have freedom from something. Romans 6:22-23 tells us, "But now that you have been set free from sin and become slaves to God, the benefit you reap leads to holiness, and the result is eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Without Jesus, we are slaves to sin. We're in bondage and we're locked in sin. It's like being on the outside of your car, and the keys are locked inside the car, where you can't get to them. The more you try to open

the door, short of breaking the window of course, the more you realize you can't get in. With sin, the more you live in sin without Jesus, the deeper and deeper you go into sin. You don't have the right key to freedom.

Other Scriptures mention other things beside sin and death that we have freedom from with Jesus. We also have freedom from anguish, accusation, tears, mourning, crying, pain, and bondage to decay.

Secondly, with Christ we have freedom in something. In John 15, Jesus says, "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit." If we remain in Christ, we will be truly free, will bear fruit for him, and be set free. This is not something we can do in our own strength. We need the Holy Spirit's power.

The third freedom is freedom to something. Galatians 5:1, 13-14 says, "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery...You, my brothers, and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather serve one another humbly in love. The entire law is summed up in a single command: Love your neighbor as yourself." We are called to be kind to one another, to serve one another in love, to witness and preach the good news of Christ to others, to comfort those who mourn, to let the light of Christ shine in and through us, to worship God, and to live as servants of God. Paul emphasizes this in this verse from Galatians when he



says we are to serve one another in love and are to love our neighbor as ourselves.

Of course, Jesus told us this repeatedly, didn't he? He also answered the question of who our neighbor is, with the story of the Good Samaritan. Kindness is important to Paul. It's important to Jesus. It should be important to us.

I like fireworks. But the problem with fireworks is that their beauty doesn't last long. We enjoy them for a few minutes, and then must wait until the next year to enjoy them again. The good news about Jesus is that he is always with us. He doesn't just last a few minutes. He'll never leave us. God has promised that his Holy Spirit is always in us if we let him in, believe him and follow him.

So, on this 4th of July, let's think about our freedoms. We can be thankful for the freedoms we enjoy as Americans, but let's also be thankful for the freedoms we all need, the freedoms that are only found in Jesus. Jesus has given us what we need to enjoy his freedoms. Let's not waste what God has given us; the freedom from sin and death, the freedom in Christ, and the freedom to serve one another in love.

Mission Committee Update

Last month, we shared with you the list of ministries Harrisonburg Baptist Church supports. You could see that we have increased the number of non-profit and mission ministries we work with and fund. Over the past few years, HBC has increased their involvement in many of our non-profit partners as well. Here are just a few examples:

Bridge of Hope: We are now working with our fourth family to provide support and encouragement as they work toward becoming self-sufficient. We have been able to engage together in picnics, a Christmas party at Ruby's Arcade, a house blessing, and Zoom cooking lessons. We've provided furniture and gifts as our family moved into a new home. We continue each week to give encouragement through phone calls, texts, emails, and cards.

Mercy House: We provide a basket of household items and cleaning supplies every time a new family is placed in our apartment. We now help to replenish the food staples in their food pantry the third week of each month. We deliver the beef and cheese from the Farm Ministry. This month that included 15 sirloin tip roasts.

Salvation Army: At Christmas, we provide Angel Tree gifts for families. This year, we added seniors to our list of those who received gifts. On the last Wednesday of each month, we provide a meal for the residents. They also receive cheese from the Farm Ministry.

Spotswood Elementary: Along with the Creation Care Team, we have helped them create their garden. We have helped in their clothes closet. We work in the Knight's Buck Store at Christmas. Most recently, Pastor Matt and a fraternity helped to build a Gaga Pit. When school is in session, we provide snacks and treats for the staff the last Friday of each month.
