Come As a Child

Most folks know I enjoy children. You may find me in the church nursery or rotating through Children's Church. I especially love the daily joys of watching my youngest grandchild, eighteen-month-old Levi, during the workweek since infancy. This has given me time to reflect on Jesus' love for children and what he teaches us about children and their faith. "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." Matthew 19:14. Jesus wanted little children to come to him not only because he loved them, but they have the kind of attitude needed to approach God. They have a simple faith needed to believe in Jesus.

Children are naturally trusting. They symbolize such qualities as humility, faith, and a Godly virtue due to their innocence. Receptiveness of little children to gentleness, loving touches and responses comes readily. That gentleness, love and grace is what our Lord offers all of us. I don't believe Jesus meant only the cute and

innocent belong to the kingdom of God, but the helpless, needy, empty-handed, weak. These too are qualities of young dependent children. Helpless is how we are to receive Jesus, or better, to be received by Jesus. A child can keep things simple and often take what they hear literally. Complete intellectual understanding is not required, it is enough to know that God loves them and provides forgiveness.

All people need childlike faith in God, not only to accept his forgiveness and gift of salvation but also for daily living. Children are able to trust and praise God without doubts or reservations. As we get older, some of us find this more difficult to do having experienced "life happening". It can be helpful to keep in touch with the childlike quality within us. I invite you to pray with me:

Dear God, give me childlike faith, removing any barriers to having a closer walk with you.

Trustees' Spotlight

A 2024 focal point for the Trustees is "Blessing HBC: Today, Tomorrow, and Beyond." HBC has a 150+ year history of ministry in Christ. It is our goal to provide ways to continue that ministry into the future. James 4:2 reminds us "We have not because we ask not..." so the first thing the congregation, as a whole, needs to do is to lift up HBC in prayer for God's continued provision and blessing. Each newsletter we will provide an opportunity for you to be a blessing to HBC: Today Tomorrow and Beyond. These ideas will also be presented at the November Business Meeting and Trustees are available for any questions that arise.

HBC has been blessed with a very generous congregation, as reflected in the budgets and Trustees' funds. While the concept of tithing 10% (a giving of our first fruits) is familiar, carrying that into tomorrow and beyond is less familiar. One way to support HBC in the future is to name HBC as a 10% beneficiary on retirement assets or life insurance policies. Working individuals and families have retirement assets and policies where 10% can grow to be a generous blessing to the future ministry of the church. Older members may be in a situation where they have outgrown the needs for life insurance (funding college or paying off a home) or may have excess in retirement assets and could consider more than 10%.

Please prayerfully consider giving to the HBC general fund and the HBC Trustees' fund by carrying your tithing into the future with your retirement funds or life insurance. If you are not sure how to do this, please do not hesitate to ask.

The ancient rabbis believed that when God created the seventh day as a day of rest (literally shabbot/ sabbath/stop) that this was the final act of creation and without this day of rest, creation was not yet finished.

Missions Minute

The Farm Ministry has been very active. In April the Farm Ministry delivered supplies to Myra, Kentucky that consisted of chicken sheds, feed for the Hens for Hope, 200 young pullets, pullet feed, feeders, waterers, seeds, fertilizer, garden supplies, donated furniture for flood victims, and approximately 650 egg cartons.

The Hens of Hope project gives struggling people a "hand up" in helping them feed themselves. There were 72 dozen eggs delivered to their local food pantry (Manna) in one week. Currently they are producing approximately 200 dozen eggs a week. The pullets delivered will be used to start a new phase that will eventually be meat birds. Included in this phase is a pilot youth program. These "at risk" youth will be trained to raise and care for chickens, helping to feed their families and community. Also, Manna will be educating the community and distributing supplies for gardens. The supplies are for a 4-county area in Appalachia.

The Beef Ministry has provided 127 pounds of beef for distribution through HBC to local food pantries. This does not include the beef used for the Bag Lunch Program or people in need within the church family.

Currently plans are for a cheese distribution in June or July.
