I've been bested by my daughter, Samantha. I have always been about the slowest eater in my dinner gatherings. Jessica, as a triplet, learned at an early age to eat quickly, but my meals have always been enjoyed at a leisurely pace. But, when I eat with Samantha, you'd think I was competing with Joey Chestnutt—the fastest hotdog eating champion of the world. Learning to take things slow can be a real gift, especially when you have elementary and middle schoolers in the home.

As our year is coasting by, I want to invite you to a special time of fellowship. On Maundy Thursday night, April 17, at 6:30 pm, we'll have a Passover Seder. The Seder is the meal that Jesus would have shared with the disciples in the upper room—the very meal that spawns our communion service. The Seder is an intricately designed meal with elements that cast our eyes to the story of God's deliverance of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. It's a family-based time to recall what God has done and what God is still doing today—providing freedom and setting free the captives.

One of my favorite themes of the Passover Seder is the permission to have rest—we no longer have to eat (or live) in haste as the first Israelites did. Because Jesus has conquered sin by his death on the cross and resurrection

### **Faithbits**

Do you document your daily life? Do you rely on your smartphone, smartwatch, or Fitbit to monitor your activity, heartbeat, or sleep patterns? I usually focus on my daily routine and don't dwell on it. However, my husband, Kent, believes that if something doesn't get recorded, it didn't happen. He diligently records his steps on his watch, his sleep patterns at night, and his caloric intake. While this approach works for him, I simply don't care about the numbers. At the end of a long day, I know I'm exhausted, so I must have taken thousands of steps, but the quantity doesn't hold any significance for me. I'm not aiming to achieve a specific fitness goal, but I still recognize that my fatigue at night is a result of my physical activity. Sometimes, when we don't actively try, we still accomplish things.

Have you ever wondered how to cultivate faith or questioned whether you have enough faith in today's world? You may discover that you possess more faith than you realize.

When it comes to spiritual fitness in our lives, sometimes we succeed in reaching our goals, while at other times, we simply can't. In such situations, we must trust that there are ordinary aspects of our lives that contain an element of faith. These seemingly insignificant elements collectively contribute to our overall spiritual well-being.

Here are some examples of faith in action:

- 1. Do you envision a positive future for your children? That's a form of faith.
- 2. Are you inspired by the faith of your ancestors? That counts as faith as well.
- 3. Do you harbor doubts? That's also a form of faith because at least you're still engaged in the question.
- 4. Do you hold those you love in your heart during their suffering? Do you pray for their aid? That's faith.
- 5. Do you love Jesus? That's faith.
- 6. Have you forgiven someone in your life? That's faith.
- 7. Do you recognize the inherent dignity of every human being? That's faith.
- 8. Have you asked someone to pray for you when you're unable to pray yourself? That's faith.
- 9. Do you express gratitude for anything in your life? That's faith.
- 10. Have you ever prepared a meal for someone, even if they didn't need it? That's faith.
- 11. Do you ever express sorrow or lament in your life? In the Bible, lamenting is a form of prayer and worship that allows individuals to express their pain and sorrow to God. By acknowledging their vulnerability, they trust in His character and promises, ultimately leading to hope and renewed faith.

Even when you're not consciously displaying faith, you're doing so to others. While we can always strive to increase our faith, perhaps let God increase your awareness of what faith already looks like in your life.

Faith is often associated with grand, sweeping gestures—miracles, profound sacrifices, or life-changing commitments. However, in reality, faith is equally present, if



not more so, in the small things we do daily. It's in the kind word we offer to a stranger, the patience we extend to a friend, and the quiet moments when we choose love over frustration. These seemingly insignificant acts form the very foundation of a life built on trust in God's goodness.

Jesus taught that faith, even as small as a mustard seed, can move mountains (Matthew 17:20). This emphasizes that faith doesn't always have to be dramatic or loud—it often manifests in simple, everyday choices. When we show kindness without expecting anything in return, we're living out the command to love our neighbor. When we forgive, even when it's difficult, we trust God to work in ways beyond our comprehension. When we help someone in need, we're serving Christ Himself (Matthew 25:40).

Every time we choose goodness, we demonstrate faith in God's plan. We trust that kindness makes a difference, even if we don't see the immediate results. We believe that love is more powerful than bitterness, that hope is stronger than despair, and that light will always triumph over darkness.

Faith isn't just about believing in God; it's about living in a way that reflects that belief. It's about trusting that He's working through us, even in the smallest moments. So, the next time you hold a door open, offer a smile, or choose patience over annoyance, remember: you're walking in faith. And those seemingly insignificant acts? They hold greater significance than you may realize.
