# Wonder Women Update

The Wonder Women group will be taking a break through the winter months and will resume meeting in March. In the meantime, you are encouraged to spend some extra time in these upcoming cold and sometimes dreary days practicing something called Wintering. Author Katherine May says that wintering is a dormant period in life, not just when Mother Nature takes a kind of break, but one in which we are all invited to pause for a bit. She says, "The changes that take place in winter are a kind of alchemy, an enchantment performed by ordinary creatures to survive... It is all very well to survive the abundant months of the spring and summer," she says, "but in winter, we witness the full glory of nature's flourishing in lean times... winter is a time of withdrawing from the world..." It is a time when we are witness to the sparseness and sometimes "sparse beauty" of the world around us. If we're open to it, winter can be a time of extended sabbath for us. May continues, "Winter is a time for reflection... and slow replenishment... for slowing down, letting your spare time expand, getting enough sleep, and resting (which she calls a radical but essential act)."

So Wonder Women, this winter when you find yourself stuck inside on a snow day or simply not wanting to go anywhere because of the bitter nip at your skin when you walk out the door, do something different. Let yourselves be challenged by the words God spoke through the Psalmist... "Come and see what

the Lord has done, the desolations he has brought on the earth... Be still, and know that I am God..." As someone who is less than fond of the cold and snowy season, I can think of no better use of these winter months.
